- Discussion surrounding LoT (including Nina, Rebecca, Laura, Lu Ann) raised about other collections on campus (conversation, museum studies, teaching/study collection). Sarah suggested a synopsis of collections to live on the landing site of LoT page; Carla noted that, in the future, the collection could be cross-referenced with other collections on campus

Undergraduate Initiatives:

- Partnership with Undergraduate Research Program (https://www.urp.udel.edu/)
- 2024 Material Culture Interdisciplinary Research Cohort Faculty affiliated with CMCS; interdisciplinary projects (stipend as research support) for faculty; once-monthly cohort meetings on zoom
- Interdisciplinary Summer Scholars: 10 weeks of research and project/cohort meetings; workshops, and Annual Undergraduate Research Summer Symposium (\$4,000 stipend for students)
- Possible to work with student for a shorter time in the summer or the extend the fellowship to the academic year
- Long-term Goal: Collaborative NEH Application in 2024-2025
- Supported in part by successful I Heart UD Giving Day Campaign from Spring
- Please let us know if you are working on a material cultured related project and would benefit from undergrad research assistant!
- Upcoming: an interest meeting in December with Rosalie Rolón Dow
- Catharine: What is a weekly hour expectation? (Answer: follows Summer scholars model, not using Workforce to log hours. Might vary by week, flexibility)
- Lu Ann: in the future could interdisciplinary groups of undergrads work together? (Answer: that's the hope at the moment, emphasizing interdisciplinary experiences with faculty. For example, if 3 faculty have 3 students, the hope is that at least once a month, the three faculty and three students meet as a cohort to discuss what's working, what's not, etc. Compensating faculty with research support to facilitate interdisciplinary support / experiences.)
- Kedron: can we have more than 1 student? (Yes)
- Kedron: In these cohort meetings, is there an expectation that all faculty attend? Or is it a representation (Answer: everyone that has a student is part of cohort, but not a weekly meeting and not in person because summer)

Discussion:

 Lu Ann: IHRC Collections-based teaching grants are interesting and maybe we should think together about this? Opportunity to develop more courses that are more interdisciplinary and to provide opportunity for students to interact with

- people at these institutions about their collections, what collections mean, what to use them for, etc.
- (Sarah: if people are currently working with community partners let CMCS know might be able to offer support for ethical and reciprocal partnerships.)
- Mary: Will there be another I Heart UD Giving Day campaign this spring for CMCS? (Yes, tailored toward undergrad support) Lu Ann: raising funds to support interns and undergrads, we should collaborate rather than compete this spring; the possibility of partnering with all the members of the Humanities Hub for a larger campaign was raised
